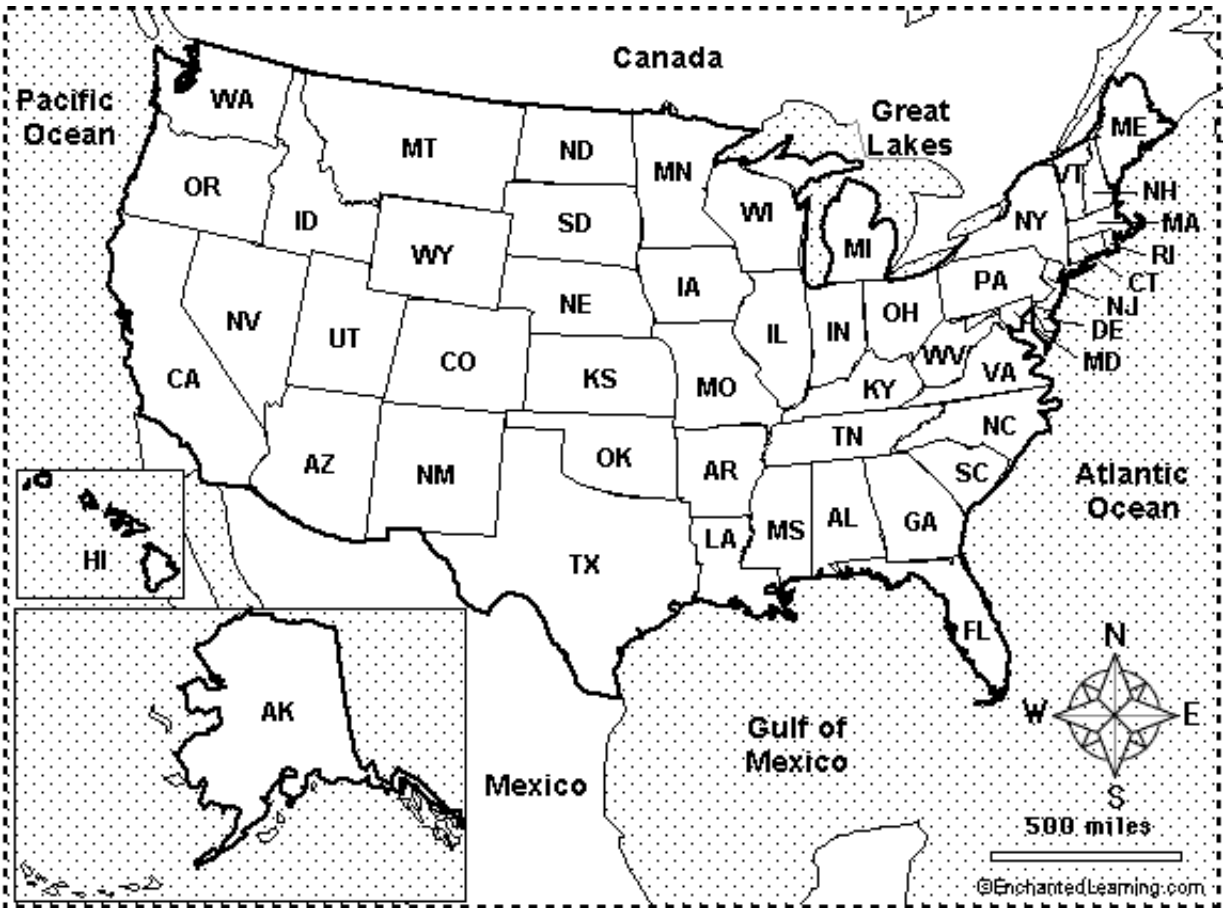
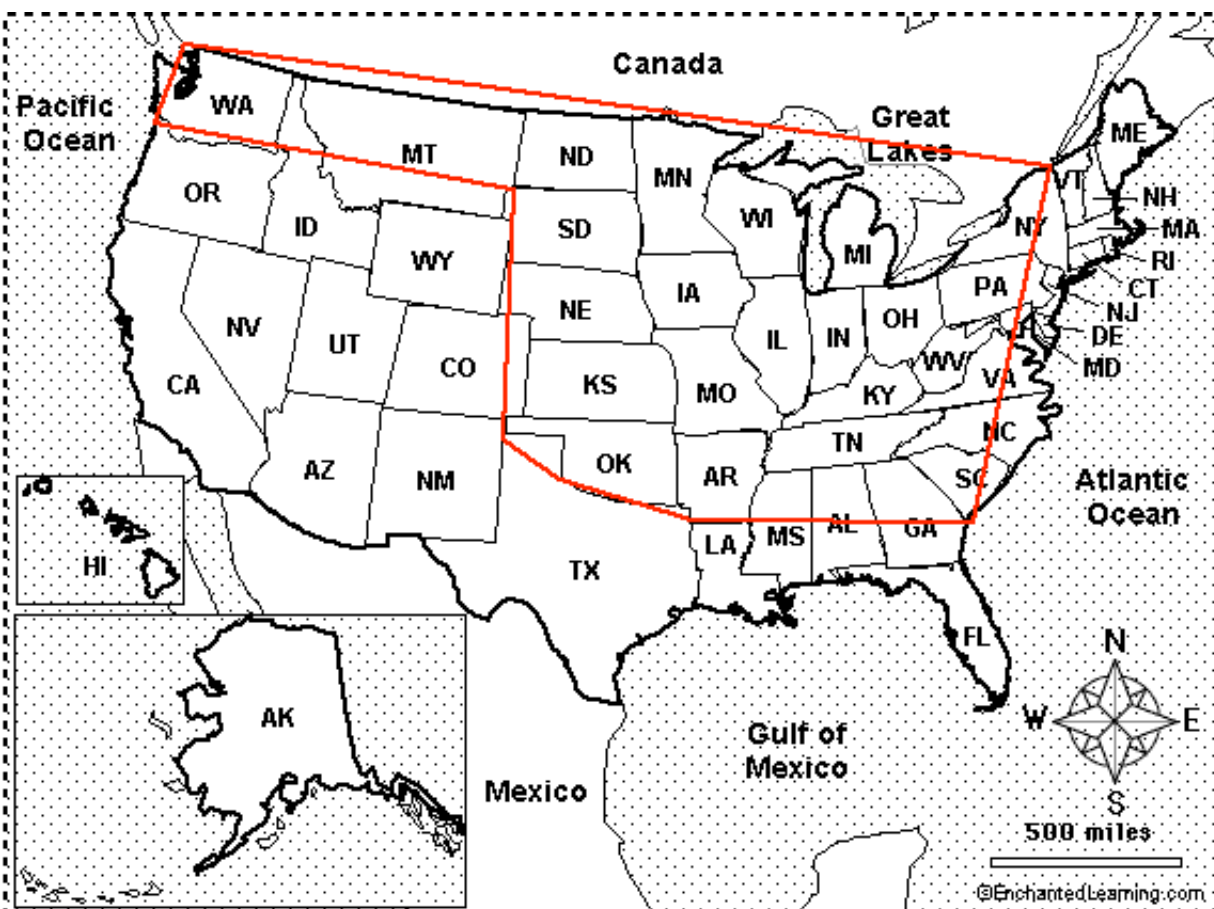


# United States of America - Follow the Instructions #5

6. From there, draw a line to the place where New York and Vermont meet Canada.
7. From there, draw a line back to the westernmost point of Washington state's border with Canada.
